



ORIEL HOSKIN 2010 ART SCHOLARSHIPS

HOW TO APPLY

1. **Submit up to three works** in any media on the theme **Life in My World**.
2. The theme may be interpreted in any way you please. "Life" may relate to people or nature. It may be direct (eg: a picture of a person) or indirect (eg: trash left behind by people).
3. It may be realistic, stylised, abstract, surreal, conceptual or in any other style you choose.
4. We are looking for insight, originality and commitment. Technical skill is a factor although it is more important that work communicates boldly.
5. **Submit a statement** of 200 words or less, setting out why you would like to do a course in art and creativity.
6. **Applications for 2010 must be submitted between 1 November and 1 December 2009. No entries will be accepted before or after these dates.**

ENTRY LEVELS

Applicants must be 16 years or older on 31 January 2010.

1. Open - any level of experience.
2. Novice - no art qualification higher than School Certificate art as at 30 September 2009 and no professional experience.

MAXIMUM DIMENSIONS OF ART WORK: 1500mm x 1000mm x 100mm

In the case of three dimensional works and other items which exceed these dimensions, it is acceptable to provide photographs. If photos are provided the dimension of the original work doesn't matter.

RULES AND CONDITIONS

The Oriel Hoskins Scholarships can be used for enrolments into any of the following: Certificate of Art & Creativity, Diploma of Art & Creativity, Diploma of Art & Creativity (Honours) or Diploma of Art & Creativity (Advanced).

Submissions must be your own original work. Each submission must be clearly labelled with the name, address and telephone number of the applicant.

By applying for the scholarship each applicant represents and warrants that his/her entry does not infringe or violate the rights of any third party.

Work done in an art class is acceptable. It is OK to submit material that has been used in other contexts (such as an exam, exhibition or competition).

The Learning Connexion Ltd (hereinafter "TLC") may make use of the work in submissions for



promotional purposes without compensation to the artist and without any requirement to seek approval for such use. TLC undertakes to look after submissions with all due care but takes no responsibility for loss or damage. Insurance, if required, is the responsibility of the applicant. Awards are not redeemable for cash.

Awards may be taken up either by enrolling for extramural study or by attending TLC onsite at our Taita Campus situated at 182 Eastern Hutt Road, Taita, Lower Hutt.

Successful applicants will be advised by mail before 24 December 2009.

Scholarships must be taken up during the year 2010 although the course of study may extend to December 2012.

Scholarships are open to permanent residents of New Zealand who meet Ministry of Education funding criteria.

TLC reserves the right to issue more or fewer scholarships than the number advertised.

To be eligible, submissions must be received prior to 5pm Friday, 1 December 2009.

Submissions will be assessed by TLC staff and awards will be made at the discretion of the Managing Director whose decision will be final.

Return of submission: Return postage (or courier fee) must be included if you want your submission returned. Packaging must be suitable for return post. Submissions will be returned by post or by courier as soon as possible after assessment.

Late submissions will be disqualified.
