## About the Deaf Scholarship

The Deaf Scholarship was set up to assist people who are Deaf or hearing impaired to study art and creativity at The Learning Connexion. We offer specialised support for Deaf and hearing impaired students and this scholarship is part of the support available, along with subtitled DVD's, notes and small class sizes. Please contact Learning Support to assess your individual needs when applying.



### What Does the Scholarship Cover?

The Deaf Student Scholarship is awarded to cover tuition fees and may be given to cover all or part of a student's fees.

### Closing Date For Applications

There is no closing date for this scholarship, you can apply any time of the year. Successful recipients will be informed within two months of receipt of application.

### Entry Requirements

- Applicants must be 16 years or older at the time of enrolment.
- Successful applicants must be able to take up enrolment within 12 months of application.
- Successful applicants must be eligible for enrolment – see Admission requirements for more details.
- Applicants must be Deaf or hearing impaired.

### How to Apply

- Submit a short statement (in text or an NZSL video) that explains:
  1. Why you would like to study at TLC
  2. What type of art you have enjoyed making in the past and what type of art you want to make in the future
  3. Your future goals, both artistic and general
- Submit three examples of recent work.
- Make sure you have read the Rules and Conditions overleaf.
- Fill out and submit the online application form. If you are unable to do this, or have any questions, then please contact the Admissions Department at [admissions@tlc.ac.nz](mailto:admissions@tlc.ac.nz).

## Rules and Conditions

- The Deaf Scholarship can be used for enrolment into any of the following: Certificate of Art & Creativity, Diploma of Art & Creativity, Diploma of Art & Creativity (Honours) or Diploma of Art & Creativity (Advanced).
- Submissions must be your own original work.
- By applying for the scholarship, each applicant represents and warrants that his/her entry does not infringe or violate the rights of any third party.
- Work done by the applicant in an art class is acceptable.
- It is permissible to submit material that has been used in other contexts (such as an exam, exhibition or competition).
- The Learning Connexion Ltd (hereinafter 'TLC') may make use of the work in submissions for promotional purposes without compensation to the artist and without any requirement to seek approval for such use.
- TLC undertakes to look after submissions with all due care, but takes no responsibility for loss or damage. Insurance, if required, is the responsibility of the applicant.
- Awards are not redeemable for cash.
- Awards may be taken up either by enrolling for distance delivery study or by attending TLC on-site at our Taita Campus, situated at 182 Eastern Hutt Road, Taita, Lower Hutt.
- Successful applicants will be advised by mail by the end of the year in which they apply.
- Scholarships must be taken up during the year following their successful application, although the programme of study may extend up to two years for part time study.
- Scholarships are open to permanent residents of New Zealand who meet Ministry of Education funding criteria.
- TLC reserves the right to issue more or fewer scholarships than the number advertised .
- Submissions will be assessed by TLC staff and awards will be made at the discretion of the Managing Director, whose decision will be final.
